Used to show that one thing belongs to another thing

1. Mr Smith's car
2. Kevin's friend's house.
3. The man's glare.
4. The cat's eyes
5. The cats' eyes.

Apostrophe of omission

Used in place of missing letters.

1. Don't, can't, wouldn't
2. I'm, I've
3. They're
4. 'cause, '60s

Put in the missing apostrophe

1. Darren didnt know the answer
2. Ive got three of those myself.
3. Peters house.
4. The pigs legs were pink.
5. We could of won the cup
6. The ball was Harrys
7. He had the same smile as his mums fathers father
